From The Chair MEMORIAL DAY, INDEPENDENCE DAY, LABOR DAY.

SUN CITY people may be cooking outdoors on a grill. Use caution with grills.

A statement from a medical reference tells me burns are mostly on children & older adults by accident. Also, deaths by burns happen at home 75% each year.

A WARNING LABEL-LIGHTER FLUIDS says: Store away from direct flames and heat sources. Don't put fluid or glowing coals or flames on a grill. Avoid prolonged skin contact & breathing fumes. Use in a well ventilated area and close the cap before igniting the coal on the grill.

PROPANE: Signs at the store where tanks are bought say "don't bring tanks inside the store" & a sign has an emergency contact number.

Experts in RV camping have warnings. Replace rusty tanks. Tanks must be recertified at every 12-yrs. The experts determined that 2 to 12-percent fumes are enough to combust! RV guides will caution: keep pilot lights out when not cooking. Tanks can explode that are kept in direct sun. Test joints with a soap and water mix.

Travel is safest with the tank valve shut off. I get the message.

DON'T LET PROPANE GET OUT OF CONTROL. Have a safe holiday.

Insurance Dropped?

Apparently several insurance companies have dropped policies even though Sun City is a Firewise Community.

We know USAA Insurance promotes the Firewise program and offers their policy holders a small discount. Some insurance companies promote Firewise but do not offer discounts.

Why is this happening? The insurance companies are probably using models projecting the probability of embers from a wildfire reaching a location. They are based on the kind of vegetation that can produce embers within 2 miles. How far embers can be carried by the wind depends on wind speed, topography, and other factors.

The construction materials for Sun City homes are relatively fire resistant. Stucco, brick and cement board don't burn. But we have wood door frames and other areas embers may collect against or enter.

If you or someone you know has been dropped by their insurance, shop around.

The First Five Feet

The Firewise concept is based on critical zones around the perimeter of the house. The most important is the 0-5 feet zone next to the house. This zone is known as the immediate zone. The goal is to reduce the potential for embers landing on or near the house to ignite dry fuels exposing the house to flames.

Shrubs can be a hazard if dry material ignites under them. The hazard can be reduced by maintaining a 6-12 inch clearance from the house wall and a 4-6 inch clearance above the mulch. Some shrubs may not by easily maintained. The need is to reduce the accumulated dry material under them.

Exposed wood is another concern. Examples are door frames (including garage) and posts would be areas of concern. Keep these areas clear of accumulated leaves and other dry material.
