From The Chair

The date Sept. 7, 2011 sticks in my mind as the wildfires hitting the Bastrop Area & Steiner Ranch.

October is fire prevention month by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). Maybe our area of Texas has escaped this year's hurricanes. We still get cold fronts.

If a wildfire is nearby, we are concerned with windblown embers. They can fall on dead leaves or other flammable material. The doors and garage frames can get a fire started on your house.

My Sun City FIREWISE group has some tips to stay safe into this fall season.

- *Make sure your gutters don't have leaves or other debris in them.
- *Clean up any leaves or other debris, including under the bushes..
- *Keep a hose ready to use with a nozzle connected on each faucet.
- *If embers of a nearby wildfire approach remove any flammable furniture, door mats or other items that can burn.
- *Call 911 if you see a fire in a neighbor's yard or in a common area.

Your Role

Every Sun City home is an important part of preventing embers from a nearby wildfire from igniting it. We want to help each homeowner to understand how and why to maintain their home to reduce the potential for wildfire embers to ignite it.

The Information

Texas A&M Forest Service will discuss how the research and information is developed. Georgetown Fire Department will relate how their services fit into the program. Sun City Staff member will cover the role of the mowed fire breaks in protecting homes. Finally, the Firewise Group will show what you can do to protect your home.


