What is Streaming TV?



It means you are watching TV shows, sports, the news, and movies over the Internet.

What is Streaming TV?

- On-demand viewing, shows/video stored in cloud, entire seasons released at once.
 Watch when/where you want. Convenient.
- Streaming allows you to watch your favorite shows on any device: phone, tablet, laptop, computer.
- There are no contracts. No price surprises.
- Streaming producers are creating their own shows. Niche content, innovative storytelling
- Live streaming: video is sent over the internet in real time, without first being recorded and stored

What do you need to stream?

Fast and stable internet

✓ Hardwired connection vs. over-the-air
✓ High definition = at least 10 Mbps
✓ 4K HDR = at least 20 Mbps

Streaming device or smart TV

- Devices/HDMI port: Roku , FireTV stick, Google Chromecast, AppleTV
- ✓ Older TV without HDMI port: adapter?
- Smart TV: connects to internet and has some streaming apps built in
- A device can be used with a smart TV if your preferred app is not available on the TV

Individual viewing preferences of the household

- What types of TV do you want: news, history, new/old movies, westerns, sports/type of, series TV, romance, home maintenance, etc.
- Video on demand, live, or both
- Suggestion: make a list of the "must have's" for everyone in the family before starting to look for an app. Then research.
- Is there a free trial? Specials?
- Ability to save to your personal library?

- Once you've made your list of "must have" shows, start researching apps
- Narrow your possible app list to those that have most/all of your preferred shows and have a subscription price within your budget
 - Look at the various service levels within each and respective prices (ads/no ads)
 - ✓ Do they offer personal libraries?
 - Do they appear easy to navigate through the channel/show options?
 - Do they offer regional programming? (Hulu & YouTube)
- Sign up for a free trial to test it

- Watch your budget! Multiple apps can really add up
- Talk to your friends about what they have and whether they like it or not

How Much Does Streaming Cost?

Television and/or streaming device (if not already owned)

Internet connection

- Bandwidth and vendor
- Make sure you have reception based on location of house

Subscription fees for apps

- Basic level (sometimes has ads, less channels)
- Premium channels

Are equipment upgrades needed?

Sample Price Sheet Hulu

\$75 - \$100 +/- month

How Much Does Streaming Cost?

Internet connection

(bandwidth, vendor bundled?)

Hulu Subscription

Hulu Basic = \$8/mo ad-supported \$18/mo, no ads

Hulu + Live TV = \$80/mo. - Includes Disney+, ESPN+, ads \$90/mo. - above + no ads \$82/mo. - ads on Hulu/ESPN+; no ads Disney \$76/mo. - Live TV only How Much Does Streaming Cost?

Sample Monthly Price Sheet

Apps can add up after you have your first app!

Assuming you have Hulu + Live TV (no ads level)

- Internet 75\$ \$100 +/- month
- Hulu+Live \$90/month
- Netflix \$15.50/mo (no ads, 2 screens)
- **Fubu** (live sports) **\$33-\$100/mo.**
- Britbox \$9/mo.

Monthly cost under this scenario: \$222.50 - \$314.50
