### **SCTPC: April 2021 Financial Synopsis**

The Club began the month of April with a cash balance of \$20,202.

Income totaled \$795; all from new memberships.

Expenses totaled \$433: training-\$62, maintenance-\$147; court cameras-\$77, Zoom subscription-\$112, and miscellaneous administrative supplies and printing-\$35.

We ended with a monthly net income of \$362 and a cash balance of \$20,563. Paid 2021 members through April totaled 999.

# USA Pickleball... by the Numbers

Here are some pickleball-related facts that reflect the growth of our sport.

First, even though 2020 (the year that wasn't) was heavily

affected by COVID, pickleball grew by over 21% and membership in USA Pickleball exceeded 42,000!

# Here are some other numbers that you might find interesting:

#### 35

Do you have a favorite ball to play with: Dura, Onix, Franklin, etc.? Well, there are currently 35 approved pickleballs, all of which may be legally used indoor or out.

#### 895

Having trouble deciding on a paddle? With 895 USA Pickleball approved paddles on the market, I'm not surprised. By the way, I have the same problem and, as a tournament player, I always have

two of the same model in my bag...just in case.

#### 1900+

That's the number of USA Pickleball ambassadors we have supporting the sport. Barb Patterson and Jo Trammell are the two we have here in Georgetown. I'm the District Ambassador for the 40 counties in central Texas.

#### 190

That's the number of tournaments that were sanctioned by USA Pickleball last year.

#### 116K

That's 116,000 competitors who played in those tournaments.

#### 438

USA Pickleball Certified Referees.

#### 243K

USA Pickleball has a community grant program and donated \$243,000 last year.

#### 16

We all know that this number represents the new courts that will be built in Sun City.

#### Pickleball Perks

One of the better perks of USA Pickleball membership is that you get a free digital copy of the bi-monthly *PICKLEBALL MAGAZINE*. I'll share my May/June copy with you here.

#### **Rules Stuff:**

I mentioned above that we currently have 438 Certified Referees (CR); actually at least 440, since we managed to get two more certified at the Cedar Park Paddle Battle last month. But not being a CR

doesn't mean that you shouldn't know the rules just as well (or better). Recent incidences at a couple of tournaments demonstrate that even CR's can get it wrong. Knowing the rules may save you a point or the match.

- 1. At the Atlantic Regional tournament, in Foley, AL, last month, one of my opponents served the ball before the CR called the score. The referee called a fault on the player. That was correct for the old 2020 rule. The new rule for 2021 says the ball is 'dead' until the referee begins to call the score and only non-volley zone faults may be call when the ball is dead. In this case, none of the other players or the CR knew the rule.
- 2. Another player at that same tournament got called for serving with one foot outside the imaginary extension of the sideline. When he argued the call, the CR agreed with him and called for a replay of the point.

That same scenario (with the same player and CR) happened at the recent Cedar Park tournament. I got called and referred them to Rule. 4.L.1., "Not touch the area outside the imaginary extension of the sideline."

I was born and raised in San Marcos, Texas. My husband, Stan, and I retired from the high-tech industry in Austin.

I played tennis weekly when, in 2008, I discovered pickleball. "What a funny name!" I thought. At that time, the Pickleball Club was offering a demonstration and an introduction class, so we took a chance to find out more about this silly sounding game. # VOLUNTEERS OF THE MONTH

### Jan Baldwin - May 2021



I grew up in Austin and started playing tennis in high school at age 15. I majored in Physical Education at UT – Austin and then taught and coached tennis in the Austin Public Schools (high school) for 3 years. I was the tennis pro at the Austin Courtyard Tennis and Swim Club for 8 years before moving to College Station to complete my master's degree.

As a graduate assistant at Texas A&M, I taught beginning, intermediate and advanced tennis in the Physical Education Activity Program. After graduation, I was offered a full-time position in the Department of Health and Kinesiology, teaching tennis, Major's classes, and supervising student teachers. By the end of the 15 years (1980 - 1994), I had achieved the position of Associate Chair of the Physical Education Activity Program at TAMU. It was during this time that I first played pickleball as an intramural sport.

From 1994 - 2015, I served as Director of Physical Education and Facility Manager at Texas A&M University at Galveston. I introduced pickleball to the students as a "rainy day activity" for the tennis classes... and then as actual pickleball classes. After retiring from the Director position, I returned to the main campus... to teach "a little."

I persuaded Frank Thomas, my friend and 1981 Pickleball partner and Director of the Physical Education Activity Program at TAMU, to include pickleball in the class offerings in the Physical Education Activity Program. It was a total success.

I moved to Sun City in 2019, where I continue to play/love pickleball and have the opportunity to continue to teach/coach this GREAT game. To my wonderful friends, Stan and Mary Payne... As I told ya"ll, some 15 years ago... I will get to Sun City... and I did!!!



"When did you graduate?" I asked.


He answered, "In 1959. Why do you ask?"
