Dorothy Jowers

An accomplished artist and instructor, Dorothy Jowers has worked in the art field for over 40 years. Formal studies include a Fine Arts Degree followed by graduate school studies from the University of Louisiana, and advanced drawing and painting classes from Odessa College and numerous other workshops.

Dorothy has taught art history, basic drawing, calligraphy, and painting in mixed media (acrylics, oil, watercolor, charcoal, pastels, etc.) privately in her home studio and in several recognized commercial studios to children, young adults and adults of all ages in Lafayette, Louisiana, Kwajalein Atoll (Marshall Islands), Anchorage, Alaska, Odessa, Texas and continues to teach privately here at home, via zoom, and at the Visual Art Center in Sun City. She also has taught children and young adults in public and private schools (preschool through high school).

Early in her career, Dorothy also worked as a Layout Artist for two printing companies and as an art and occupational therapist for a state mental health facility.

Dorothy's personal works of art include color studies, landscapes, botanicals, realism, and abstract in a wide variety of media. She has explored many other modalities of art to include jewelry, pottery, and stained glass.

Dorothy is member of the Alaska Watercolor Society and served on their Board of Directors. Currently, she co-chairs the Visual Art Center Education Committee in Sun City.
