





What is it?


Some definitions:



The iCloud uses the internet to greatly expand the capabilities of your local computer and mobile devices.



Cloud computing is a kind of Internet-based computing, where shared resources, data and information are provided to computers and other devices on-demand.



Cloud computing is a type of computing that relies on sharing computing resources rather than having local computers or personal devices to handle applications

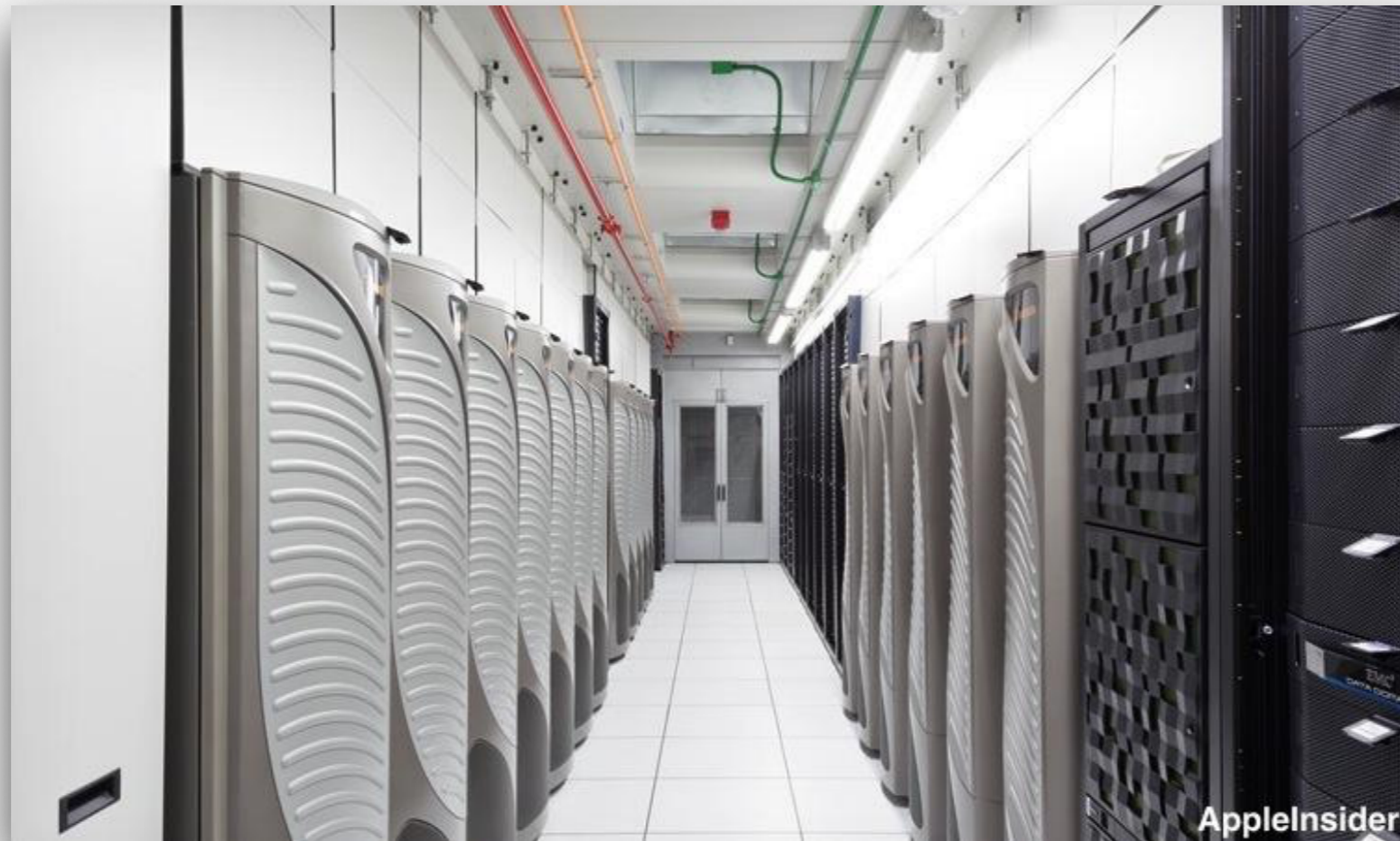
Apple iCloud data center = 500,000 sq feet
