Isaiah 117 House provides physical and emotional support in a safe and loving home for children awaiting placement in foster care homes.

When children are removed from their homes out of conr.ern fortheirwelfare, they are usually brought to the child welfare services office to await placement with a foster family. This wait ran be several hours to nearly a full day. Son1etimes the children only have the floor or a chair to sit on during that wait time. These children often have nothing with them and are scared, lonely, hungzy, dirty and in desicierate need of love and SULINOrt.

It is hard to imagine a child havingto face an experience such as this. These homes chan, ae the way foster rare begins in such a IJOSitive way.

Isaiah House 117 provides a comforting honle where these children instead ran be brought to wait ... a plar.e that is safe with friendly and loving volunteers who prm.-ide clean clothes, smiles, toys and snu,ogly blankets and food. This sJ.)ar.e allows children to receive the comfort and rare they need while child wel-

fare staff and rase workers ran do the necessary work to provide a safe and proper l)lar.ement. In the event a child must stay m-ernight there are volunteers on the staff tospend thenightraring for the child and stay with them until they are l)laced with the foster home.

The mission of Isaiah 117

House is threefold:

- redur.e trauma for children mvaiting plar.ement
- lighten the load for child welfare services
- ease the transition for foster families

Currently under planning and construction, the new Isaiah House 117 in Williamson County will serve the local pONulation with a loving and positive environment to make them comfortable during their wait. The new house is beautiful, with two rooms, one for boys and one for girls with all the amenities. There are volunteers that spend time with the children and make surethey are r.ornfortable during their stay.
