And then my poor meatball rolled out of the door.

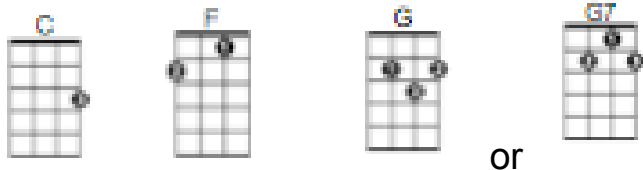
F C
