Notes & Tips

1. Strum Patterns

This 4-beat strum pattern is used throughout the song. In this strum we'll add a fan stroke on beat #2. The fan stroke is a down-stroke using all four fingers.

For those who would like to try something more challenging, you can also add a "chuck" strum on beat #3.



In both cases, for those who prefer, playing a single strum on each chord change can be used as a simplified strum throughout the entire song.

In addition to these strum patterns, the following rhythm indicators are also used in the chart to show a change in the pattern:

[*stop*: x] = Strum this chord (x) once and immediately mute the strings

[*strum:* x] = Start/resume strumming on this chord (x) following a [*stop*]

Pause singing for a beat or take a breath

2. Intro Tab

The following tab can be played during the **Intro** while other players strum the indicated chords. It can also be played as a solo part. As noted, it is played through twice, and can be played with either high-G or low-G tuning.



3. Instrumental Tab

The following tab can be played during the **Intro** while other players strum the indicated chords. As noted, it is played through twice, and can be played with either high-G or low-G tuning.



This instrumental section can also be played as a chord melody. The notes in **red** indicate the melody. As noted, it is played through twice, and can be played with either high-G or low-G tuning.



3. Instrumental Tab, continued

Those playing in high-g tuning can take advantage of the high-g string by playing the chord melody using this tab. The notes in **red** indicate the melody. As noted, it is played through twice.
