When Gwen and Mike Snyder adopted their new little dog eight months ago, many said that she reminded them of a little deer.



So they thought of the name Bambi. But then they remembered that Bambi was a boy so the next name they thought of was that of Bambi's "girlfriend," Faline. That is how Faline Snyder got her name.

Mike and Gwen moved to N64 six years ago. Mike, a retired NASA scientist and Gwen, a retired attorney, moved here from Dripping Springs, TX. Both lifelong Texans, they have been married for 30 years and have almost always had a dog in their lives. Since the beginning of their marriage, they have had a long line of amazing dogs that have given them an endless array of experiences and memories.

They started out taking on Mike's dad's dog, Puff, a Sheltie. Then they found Pepper, also a Sheltie, and the two became best friends. After they were gone, they adopted an Australian Sheppard, named Kylie, who was deaf and blind. After a beautiful life, Kylie passed and they met rescue dog Shiloh. "It was instant love," said Mike and Gwen. When they moved into Sun City, they had Shiloh with them. She loved N64 and took countless walks on Hobby and Hamilton. After Shiloh passed away in 2022 at 14 years old, Mike and Gwen mourned as they describe, "deeply and horribly." But after time, they gradually found themselves peeking at the Georgetown Shelter Dogs website and waited for a pup who felt was theirs. That was when Faline appeared. "She's shy and has had a slow adjustment," they explained, "but she was found after being abandoned in an apartment complex and has an unknown history." Mike and Gwen describe their little pup as "gentle and sweet, and tentative around dogs and people she doesn't know. She's a wonderful dog and a joy to have in our lives."

Mike said, "We really worry that Faline's habit of barking at dogs on her daily walks has given her a bad reputation around the neighborhood." They want everyone to know they are working diligently with her on redirecting her behavior so that she will stop unwanted barking. Faline has three best friends near her house on Hobby: Augie Oliver (her very favorite dog), Henry Troxell, and Lily Mertens. They make a wonderful group of playmates and have fun greeting each other on their walks.

Mike, Gwen, and Faline are a lovely family who enjoy being part of the N64 neighborhood.



#### ·INTERESTING APOLLO 11 FACTS·

- · Apollo 11 crew had to go through customs after landing back on Earth. The items they declared included moon dust and moon rocks.
- ·The crew had to remain in quarantine for 21 days after returning.
- ·Neil Armstrong said his famous quote differently than he had planned. He meant to say "One small step for a man, one giant leap for mankind."
- The Apollo 11 crew couldn't afford to take out life insurance in case anything went wrong on the mission. As an alternative Armstrong, Aldrin and Collins signed hundreds of photographs known as "insurance covers" so the families could sell them in a worst case scenario.
- The crew left a goodwill disc (the size of a 50¢ piece) on the moon which features statements from 73 countries. The inscription reads, "Goodwill messages from around the world brought to the moon by the astronauts of Apollo 11." Around the rim it says, "From Planet Earth -- July 1969"
