#### **HOW TO PROTECT YOUR HOME** WHEN YOU ARE AWAY

Don't be a home burglary victim—take the time and effort to make it tough for anyone to get in to your home. Below are some burglary prevention tips to refer to when you're planning to be away from home:

- · Make sure it appears you are home while you're away. Light and moderate noise may deter burglars.
- Use plug-in timers on lamps to simulate occupancy.
- · Leave shades and blinds as you usually do; however, make sure the garage windows are covered so no one can see if your car(s) are in or not.
- · Use timers to have the TV or radio turn on and turn off during the day and at night.
- · Have lawns mowed, sidewalks swept, hedges clipped on schedule. Trim all shrubbery around windows so would-be burglars can't use them for cover.
- · Lock all exterior doors securely. All exterior doors should have dead-bolt locks. Lock gates to your yard.
- · Use safety latches on the windows to keep below-average crooks honest.
- · Form a neighborhood crime watch with the assistance of your local police department.
- · Ask a trusted neighbor to watch your property when you are away; do the same for them.
- · Arrange to have a neighbor pick up your mail, circulars and newspapers when you are on vacation. Or, arrange with your post office to hold your mail.
- Never advertise your departure. This may be easier said than done, especially for those who often share personal information on social networking sites (such as Facebook and Twitter).
- · Install locks that wedge and bolt in sliding doors and double hung windows.
- · Invest in a good alarm system. Check with the Better Business Bureau to be sure the security company is reliable. At the very least, buy a few alarm company signs—eBay is good for that purpose.
- · Request a Security Check from GPD while you are away. The form is located at https://pd.georgetown.org/files/2014/01/ Security-Check-Form0001.pdf. Be sure to read the fine print! Print out the form, fill it in, and take it to GPD, at 809 Martin Luther King Blvd.

#### Resources for the Elderly in Williamson County

s an age-restricted community with an average age of 71, it is only natural that from time to time we are confronted with the difficult task of dealing with dementia-related issues. While I am not an expert on this subject, nor are we an assisted living facility, it is important for us as a community to understand this sensitive subject and be able to help those it affects in a proper manner. As such, the intent of this article is to remind the community that dementia exists in Sun City Texas, and, while it surfaces in a variety ways, we should not turn our backs on this matter, but approach it in a way that is supportive, informed and caring.

As with most municipalities, social services are available within the city and county structure to assist families who are dealing with dementia-related issues. The same is true with Williamson County and the City of Georgetown. While the private sector has a multitude of services available, here are a few services and nonprofit organizations that provide aging resources within Williamson County.

AGE of Central Texas provides education and support to people all along the spectrum of growing older, no matter where they are on that journey. ### Board Member Views Submitted by Dennis Walter, Treasurer

#### **Board Activity**

I have chosen not to run for the Board of Directors this year and want to thank those residents who supported my election last year. It has been a privilege serving the community as a member of your Board.

The Board has been very busy since last May. First, we formed a working group of staff and committee members to address projects for conversion of common area irrigation from potable to non-potable water. The group considered four projects that had been identified by the Water Conservation Subcommittee. We developed a program with work scheduled over three years and identified methods of funding the projects; the Board approved the program in August. The project at Cowan Creek Pond 5 is now complete, and the fishing pond project is close to completion and, hopefully, will be productive this summer. Two other projects are underway with wells finished and may be complete by the end of the year. Total financial savings to the Association will be about \$200,000 per year. Additionally, we are aiding the city in their water conservation effort.

#### SHINGLE REPLACEMENT

Another Board decision was required for the selection of a contractor to replace the shingles on all Community Association buildings. Hail damage in excess of \$1 million was covered by our insurance; we were very careful to select a company known for quality work and had the capability to perform a very large project.

#### **PUTTERS CAFÉ**

The search for a new restaurant operator was a challenge. Fortunately, Cecy Padilla and Darren Hendricks responded with great ideas and attitudes; we negotiated a lease agreement and proceeded to renovate the facility. Putters Café opened in March— I highly recommend that all residents give it a try!

#### PROPERTY INSURANCE RENEWAL

The Association's property insurance renewal also became a real challenge, since most major insurance companies are no longer covering wind and hail damage in Texas. Of course, our large claim from the storm last spring was a negative factor for Sun City Texas. We do have adequate coverage now, but at a higher price and with larger deductibles.

Your Board will continue to meet the challenges ahead and is making a real effort to stay aware of the community's activities and needs.

April 21, which is being rerun on Channel 79 each evening at 8 p.m. and is available for viewing on the Sun City Texas website. The Elections Committee has mailed one ballot to every homeowner. Each mailing contains: ballot with instructions, candidate statements and a small return envelope. There are two vacancies for resident directors on the Board of Directors for the SCTXCA. You may vote for up to two of the candidates listed by placing an "X" in the box next to their name, or your two selections may be a combination of listed candidates and write-in candidates. There is no limit on the number of terms a Board member may serve. Per state law, a ballot must be signed in order to be valid. To protect your privacy, a third party has been hired to remove ballots from the envelope and tally results. Ballots should be filled out, signed by the homeowner in the space allotted, and inserted into the small return envelope. Please remember to verify that the return information printed on the return envelope is correct. Ballots should be returned either in-person, put in the ballot boxes at Cowan Creek or the Social Center Monitors Desks, or mailed in time to be received before the end of the balloting period, which is 1 p.m. on Thursday, May 22.

If you will not be at your Sun City Texas residence to receive a mailed ballot, please provide the Community Association with a correct mailing address for your ballot. Begin checking your calendars for the dates of your trips, etc., to determine if the election dates might affect you. If you do not receive a ballot in the mail or it becomes lost, additional ballots will be available at the Member Services Office.

#### Firewise & Wildfire Community Preparedness Day 2014

Sun City Texas will be participating in the National Wildfire Community Preparedness Day on Saturday, May 3. Communities across the nation will conduct projects designed to reduce wildfire risk and increase preparedness.

Sun City Texas will join the effort by conducting a Common Areas clearing event. All residents are invited to participate.

#### **HOW YOU CAN HELP**

Our morning will begin with a safety orientation and brief Firewise education presentation in the Social Center Ballroom at 9:30 a.m. Participants will be divided into several workgroups and will proceed to predetermined Common Area worksites near the ballroom and Legacy Hills, where we will remove small cedar trees. Following our fun outdoors, we will return to the ballroom for hot dogs, soft drinks and door prizes. Each participant will be given a specially-designed cap in appreciation of their participation.

Work gloves and closed-toe shoes are required. Long pants are highly recommended. Participants should bring their own hand-held pruners, tree limb loppers and/or handsaws marked with their name. No power equipment will be used during this activity.

#### **ABOUT FIREWISE**

Our Firewise program is comprised of four major groups/programs.

- 1. The Home Ignition Zone (HIZ) Assessment Program has more than 50 trained volunteers who evaluate residential properties to identify outside ignition sources, in the event of traveling or falling embers from a wildfire or a house fire. More than 650 homeowners have participated in this program!
- 2. The Vine and Cedar Clearing Group works with the CA staff to clear cedars and ladder fuels in the Level 4 area. Together, the crew and staff have cleared approximately 176 acres since the program began in 2011.
- 3. **The Education Group** organizes the annual Firewise Town Hall and takes the Firewise program to New Resident Orientations and various other Town Halls. The group also offers Firewise training to landscape vendors who work in Sun City Texas.
- 4. The Community Wildfire Protection & Re-certification Plan (CWPP) Group collects data during the year to be used in supporting our annual Firewise recertifica-

tion process. The national Firewise program requires that participants maintain and report activities annually to maintain certification.

As central Texas continues to be under a severe drought, residents are encouraged to request a Home Ignition Zone (HIZ) Assessment to evaluate the risks of a fire caused by falling embers from a wildfire or house fire. This year, we have already had a grassfire at the Del Webb entrance, a house fire caused by a lightning strike, and a small yard fire. The HIZ request form is available online at the Firewise microsite, and at the Social Center and Cowan Creek Monitors Desks.

Remember, it's too late to make preparations if the fire is already happening.

#### **Water Matters**

Irrigation systems should be running spring programs throughout Sun City Texas. Below is an excerpt from the Water Ambassador Handbook on controller programming. If you need help from a Water Ambassador, or are interested in joining their ranks, please contact your Neighborhood Representative.



#### I. CONTROLLER PROGRAMMING

After familiarizing yourself with the irrigation site, setting up the controller is next. There are two types of controllers installed in Sun City Texas: the Hunter Pro-C and the Rain Bird ESP. Both are fairly user-friendly and use a similar dial and button interface.

#### a. Set the Current Time and Day

This is the most critical part of the program, and usually the culprit for most unexpected watering cycles—particularly the AM/PM settings. Another common disruption to this setting can be power outages or surges. Both controllers use 9-volt batteries to illuminate the display when power is unavailable. It is always best to have a good battery in place. An important note on the Rain Bird controllers: they only use a rechargeable 9V battery.

#### b. Determine Station Run Times

Since every lot is different, the following recommendations have been generalized. Differences in household water pressures, soil depth, slope of the yard, sun and shade, and proximity to a neighboring system will affect how long a station actually needs to run.

The <u>summer</u> target goal for applied water is one inch (1") per week. If you are watering two days a week, that is .5 inches per day. Average water outputs are as follows:

Type Spray Nozzles 1.5 inches/hour
Rotor Heads .6 inches/hour
Rotary Nozzles .4 inches/hour
To get .5 inches of water for the above listed:

Spray Nozzles 20 minutes Rotor Heads 50 minutes Rotary Nozzles 75 minutes

It is important to remember that these are guidelines, and that each yard is different. Consider these run times a starting point and adjust them as necessary, hopefully downward.

#### c. Determine Start Times

To avoid water runoff, it is advised that multiple start times be considered. Three start times are recommended for the above run times, making the programmed run times as follows:

Spray Nozzles 6 minutes Rotor Heads 16 minutes Rotary Nozzles 25 minutes

Calculate the total run time for all stations on the program to determine the proper separation between start times. For example, if the total program run time is 2 hours and 17 minutes,

appropriate start times would be midnight, 2:30 a.m. and 5 a.m.

#### d. Water Days

The actual days that watering can occur are determined by the City of Georgetown. The system is based on the last digit of the address for the location of the controller.

#### Two Days per Week

Even numbers – Wednesday and/or Sunday Odd Numbers – Tuesday and/or Saturday No watering may occur on Mondays.

#### e. Rain Sensor

All controllers installed on homes after January 1, 2009, should be equipped with a rain sensor by state law. The rain sensor can suspend irrigation after a rain event up to 48 hours if conditions are right; however, 24 hours is typical. There should be a switch on the face of the controller allowing the sensor to be **active** or **bypassed**. Make sure that this switch is on. Other types of sensors are available and should be wired in series to allow control from the face switch.

Return the dial to the **Auto** or **Run** position to engage the program.

#### **Reptile Activity as Spring Approaches**

The approaching spring and recent warm weather are combining to awaken our scaly little friends. When temperatures consistently exceed 55 to 60 degrees, you can expect to encounter reptiles in Sun City Texas. Most of these encounters will impose no danger to our residents; however, we share Sun City with two very dangerous critters: the western diamondback rattlesnake and the Texas coral snake.

Residents are encouraged to know how to identify these snakes and to avoid them. Googling "western diamondback rattle-snake" and "Texas coral snake" will provide you with copious images.

Residents are strongly urged NOT to kill any snakes. Inexperienced residents are putting their lives in danger when they try to kill or remove rattlesnakes.

Texas coral snakes are dangerous, but are not prone to bite humans. They are very timid and will try to avoid you.

How does rattlesnake behavior contribute to encounters, and what can we do to minimize the danger?

#### **Rattlesnakes:**

- 1. Are nocturnal creatures. Residents should carry a strong flashlight when walking at night. Many dogs react to snakes with curiosity; keep pets on a short leash!
- 2. Like to hide in caves. Residents should not leave garage doors open or cracked.
- 3. Hide under rocks. Residents must be careful when turning over or moving rocks.
- 4. Feed almost exclusively on rats and mice. Rats and mice feed almost exclusively on seeds. Birds scatter seeds around bird feeders; minimize things in your landscape that attract rats and mice. Feed the birds by planting native plants which bear fruits that birds prefer.
- 5. Are ambush predators. They lie in wait for prey. Watch for them coiled up in your landscape.

Sun City Texas residents have experienced at least three envenomations in the last three years. Don't think it can't happen to you. The AMA recommends that the only response to a rattlesnake bite is to call 911 and/or proceed to the nearest Emergency Room. If bitten, **DO NOT:** 

- 1. Put a tourniquet above the bite.
- 2. Cut the skin at the bite.
- 3. Try to suck out the venom.
- 4. Drink alcohol.
- 5. Apply ice.
- 6. Take antihistamines.

Try to stay as calm as possible!

It is not important that you take the snake to the Emergency Room for identification.

If you have a reptile in your space, call one of our volunteers for snake identification:

We have the experience, education and equipment to handle the situation safely. We will relocate harmless snakes at a resident's request, but we recommend harmless snakes be left in the landscape. **Rattlesnakes and coral snakes must** be destroyed.

#### REDUCING WATER CONSUMPTION

For those of you who are interested in making some water reducing changes to your yard, the following actions can be completed without paperwork:

- · Replacing Bermuda Tiff with Zoysia
- Replacing traditional shrubs with drought-resistant or low-water plantings in existing beds
- Removing trees that are less than 19 inches in circumference measured 12 inches from the ground

#### **COMMON AREAS**

On another note, a reminder that our Common Areas belong to the entire community, with responsibility for their maintenance assigned to the Community Association staff and volunteer committees. Modifying or trespassing on the Common Areas is prohibited unless under the direction or supervision of those persons responsible for its appearance.

#### **MEMORIAL DAY**

As with all our holidays, banners and/or other holiday appropriate items may be displayed for seven days before and after the holiday, as well as on the day itself. #### **Landscaped Maintained Homes**

Spring has sprung in Sun City Texas and the wildflowers are in full bloom. We are in the process of finishing the spring plant replacements for the year. If you are able and willing, we ask that you help us establish the new plants with a little hand-watering. If you're not able, that is perfectly OK. Also, we will be extending beds, applying top dressing and installing new turf where needed.

Depending on the weather, our next time for planting replacements will be in early fall. At that time, we will be installing evergreen plant material only, no perennials.

#### **TCB PRUNING**

TCB pruning crews are instructed to trim plants from sidewalks, walls, air conditioner units, and roof lines. TCB's pruning schedule works by trimming approximately 25 homes in a particular neighborhood during each mowing visit. With this schedule, every home will be trimmed once a month. The irrigation is set to water two (2) days a week according to the City of Georgetown's watering schedule. We will remain at two (2) days per week for the entire summer and into fall.

#### **Veteran Burial Benefits**

Are you an honorably discharged veteran from active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces? If so, you and your spouse probably are eligible for this incomparable State of Texas Veterans Cemetery benefit. Internment at the Central Texas State Veterans Cemetery-Killeen is at no cost for the veteran and minimal cost for the spouse. The benefit includes: space, concrete liner (for caskets), opening/closing, headstone, engraving, and perpetual care. There are three options for cremated remains: Columbarium Wall; Scattering Garden; and In-ground Internment. Military Honors are arranged through your Funeral Director.

Misinformation continues to keep eligible veterans from applying for this benefit, including:

- · You must be a Texas resident. False.
- My spouse cannot be buried there. **False**.
- · You must be killed in action. False.
- · You must be a disabled or retired veteran. False.

Unlike the National System, the Texas program allows you to pre-register. For information, call the CTSVC at 254-616-1770, or call the CTSVC Outreach Volunteer, Sun City Texas resident J. Paul Comola, at 512-819-9953 to arrange an appointment. Paul has all the required forms and will assist you with pre-registration. You will need a copy of your DD214 and marriage certificate. It is highly recommended that you visit the cemetery before completing the paperwork. A visit will help to understand the program and make you proud of this benefit that is available to veterans; a benefit you have earned!

The Central Texas State Veterans Cemetery is located about 13 miles north of Florence on SH 195 (out the Sun City Texas back gate and left on SH 195). All Sun City Texas residents are welcome to visit the cemetery, which is open to the public daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.





### Bill McNinch Aquatic Personal Trainer: Julie O'Connor

William "Bill" McNinch sometimes defines his life in two parts: young and not-so-young. "Younger, to me, means any time before my amputation," says the 74-year-old retired banker from Houston, whose right leg was amputated above the knee in 2010 due to complications from a prior surgery. He now walks with a prosthesis and a cane for balance. "I've exercised off-and-on all my life, sometimes more seriously than other times," he adds. "I completed two marathons in my 40s. Many years ago, I played tennis. I took up golf when I was 64, and I've had to relearn that since my amputation. I used to swim a good bit, but after my amputation I sank like a rock."

The situation presented a unique challenge even for seasoned aquatic personal trainer Julie O'Connor, who began working weekly with Bill at the Sun City Texas Fitness Center pool in November 2013, with the goal of helping him relearn the mechanics of swimming. "Some of our earlier training sessions focused on finding his center of buoyancy, balance exercises, and streamlining in preparation for swimming," says Julie. After conquering pool entry and exit, she adds, sessions included the use of an aqua-balance board in a vertical, seated position to address core strength, and an aqua-jogger belt to coax Bill into a streamlined position.

"Vertical exercises emphasized maximum extension of Bill's amputated leg to achieve range of motion in both hips," says Julie, remembering that the tedious but necessary exercises could at times be frustrating for Bill, whom she describes as a quiet, humble man who greatly values his independence. Once core strength and balance improved, training sessions began to focus on body rotation in a horizontal position. The last piece of the puzzle, and the key to Bill finally swimming laps independently, was the addition of a fin for extra leverage with his left leg. "Bill is now enjoying lap swimming," says Julie, happily noting that Bill is also able to enter and exit the pool without assistance. These days, along with his frequent pool workouts, he walks at the Cowan Creek Fitness Center's indoor track, lifts weights, and enjoys playing nine holes of golf with neighborhood friends.

"Julie taught me to swim again," says Bill, who considers swimming a great overall exercise for both muscle and cardiovascular strength. "She gave me the confidence and the tools to accomplish my goal."

# Healing with Energy The practice of Qigong

igong (pronounced "chee-gung") is an ancient Chinese practice that aims to cultivate "qi," a Chinese word best translated as vital energy or life force, through posture, breathing and mental focus. Similarly, the second part of Qigong, taken from the word "gung," is Chinese for accomplishment or skill through steady practice. Altogether, the Qigong is meant to be a system practiced for increased health and vitality.

Through the combination of specific movements and stationary poses, breathing techniques and concentration, participants focus on self-healing through circulating qi from within themselves to cleanse and heal the body. Some practices also focus on storing qi or emitting qi with the goal of helping those individuals and the world around them.

The style of Qigong is similar to that of Tai Chi and Kung Fu; however, it is suitable for all ages.

The gentle, fluid nature of Qigong can help reduce stress, build strength, increase stamina, and enhance the immune system. According to the National Qigong Association, the practice also has been found to improve cardiovascular, respiratory, circulatory, lymphatic and digestive functions.


This form of exercise is practiced world-

t was the biggest financial failure in history to that point—a project that brought down a government and killed 30,000 or more people dedicated to its completion. The final accomplishment used technology and science developed just in time by its creative designers and visionaries. Now, 100 years after its completion, the Panama Canal still stands as a lasting monument to the perseverance, innovation, and gutsy fortitude of its creators.

Recently, my husband, Nick Martinez, and I were passengers with 52 others on a small ship that embarked on a commemorative passage during this 100th anniversary year. We met our ship, the M.Y. Variety Voyager, in Cartagena, Columbia, a 500-year-old Caribbean port

whose riches consistently attracted loothunting pirates like Henry Morgan and Sir Francis Drake. Although a city of glass and skyscrapers these days, it is the colonial old town, with its Caribbean colors, cool plazas, and flower-bedecked balconies that draws the tourist crowds. A rough sea passage from Cartagena brought us to Colon, at the Atlantic entrance to the Panama Canal, and gave us the opportunity to see the construction of a new set of locks (which were about 70 percent complete when we saw them). The new locks will increase not only the capacity of the current canal, which can only serve 35-40 ships in a 24-hour period, but will also enable larger ships to use the canal. Also, the construction of the new locks will incorporate a water conservation system that will reduce by 60 percent the current 52 million gallons now used for the transit of each ship through the canal.

That evening in Colon, just at twilight, we began our nine-hour passage of the Canal by entering the Gatun Locks, a three-step series that raised the ship to Lake Gatun, 85 feet above sea level. The lake, created by damming the Chagres River, is the largest man-made lake in the world. This watershed river, and the 200 inches of rain it gets each year, are what drive the locks of the canal and the dam that provides all the electricity for canal operations and Panama City on the Pacific side of the canal.

### **BACK TO THE BEGINNING**

France, inspired by the vision of Ferdinand DeLessups, who had completed the Suez Canal just a few years earlier, embarked on the initial construction of the Panama Canal in 1881, and through private funding worked on it until 1894 when work was abandoned due to cost and disease. The French government fell, as thousands who had invested in the project lost their life savings. Work wasn't resumed until 10 years later, when Theodore Roosevelt was elected President of the United States and envisioned the benefits to the U.S. Navy of having a route from one ocean to another that saved a travel distance of more than 8,000 miles.

When Columbia, which at the time included Panama within its borders, balked at terms the U.S. proposed for the canal, Teddy Roosevelt used "gunboat diplomacy" to engineer a bloodless revolution that made Panama independent and able to negotiate its own terms. The elimination of Yellow Fever and Malaria were over-riding concerns for the Americans, and, having been successful in eliminating these diseases during the recent Spanish-American War in Cuba by targeting the mosquito populations, the U.S. now initiated the most costly hygiene campaign the world had ever seen. The Chief Engineer of the canal at the time estimated that every mosquito killed had cost the U.S. government \$10, but the campaign was successful in eliminating the threat of those diseases. By 1914, the Americans were celebrating the completion of the Panama Canal ahead of schedule and under budget. The

50-mile passage, with its three sets of locks—one on the Atlantic Ocean side and two on the Pacific Ocean side, was then, and remains today, one of the manmade wonders of the world. The U.S. turned operations and control of the Panama Canal over to the Panamanians at the beginning of 2000.

### **100 YEARS LATER**

The morning after the canal transit found us docked in Panama City, at the Pacific entrance. With a population of 700,000, Panama City is a bustling modern city of skyscrapers—80 percent of which did not exist 10 years ago. In the near future, a sure-fire tourist-draw will be the not-yet-completed Biomuseo, a museum which celebrates the incredible biodiversity of the region in both flora and fauna. Designed by "deconstructivist" architect Frank Gehry, Panamani-

ans joke that the building looks like it was hit by a tornado.

On our way up the coast of Panama to our final destination in Costa Rica, we stopped to do some snorkeling at tiny Granito de Oro island, an experience that resembled swimming in an aquarium, through schools of colorful sergeant major fish, angel fish, parrot fish, and others too numerous to catalog.

At other stops, we walked through towering lush rainforests, ogled scarlet macaws and toucans, and marveled at the variety of orchids and bromeliads that grow so prolifically here. As we unpacked our winter jackets to head home, we couldn't help but wish we could somehow take the white sand beaches and warm turquoise waters with us as an antidote for one of the coldest Texas winters in recent memory.







# May Tips for a Beautiful Water Wise Landscape

By Winola VanArtsdalen

May is a beautiful time of year in central Texas and one of the joys is preparing habitat for our abundant wildlife. Why discuss butterflies when our purpose is to save water? The more you study ecology, the more you learn that soil, plants and wildlife are all part of one related system—helping one improves the well-being of all others, including ourselves. When we build soil to hold moisture, the result is healthier plants. When we provide for wildlife by limiting chemicals and choosing native plants, the result is a healthier ecosystem for all to enjoy.

For butterflies, you need both food plants for caterpillars and plants with nectar for the adult butterflies. Last summer I had a fennel plant eaten back almost to nothing most of the summer. When anyone commented about it, I would point to the butterflies on my Gregg's mistflower and respond, "That's why!" Do not worry if you see caterpillars eating foliage from plants, as the foliage will grow back. Swarms of butterflies visited my Gregg's mistflower. In doing so, they pollinated my mistflower while harvesting nectar, which will provide me with more beautiful flowers this year. Nature has a way of paying its debts!

It is important to provide food source for

all our wildlife, especially for the monarchs, which are seriously threatened due to loss of habitat. The butterflies we see on Gregg's mistflowers are queens, as explained to me by fellow Master Gardener and local butterfly expert, Wayne Rhoden. Monarchs were rarely seen last year, but we have many queens who love the Gregg's mistflower.

Countless favorite flowers bring butterflies to your yard, including: fennel, parsley, and antelopehorn milkweed for larval food; and purple coneflower, phlox, black-eyed Susan, and Gregg's mistflower for adult nectar. In the binder titled *What Grows Here*, prepared by our Sun City Garden Club (available at both Monitor Stations), there is a line for each plant labeled "Attracts" where it is listed if the plant attracts birds, butterflies, bees, etc. There is also a reference on the Garden Club website for a recommended book on butterflies.

It is late to be planting flowers now, so do keep new plants close to the house and/ or a water supply to hand water. If you have a rain barrel, that's the ideal spot!

# **MAY GARDENING TIPS:**

 The best prescription for health in your landscape is a soil test with the necessary amendments added, plant-

ing the right plant in the right place, and avoiding overwatering. Diverse, abundant native habitat will bring more beneficial insects and fewer pest insects.

- Check your irrigation system monthly, especially now with summer approaching, to be sure everything is working properly.
   Look to see if there are places you could change to drip irrigation for the health of your plants and saving water.
- For healthy turf, keep mower blades sharp, never mow more than 1/3 the height of the grass, and minimize fertilizer.
- Bermuda was fertilized earlier. Buffalo and zoysia can be fertilized late April to early May. If you spread top dressing, skip this fertilization, or it will be too much nitrogen.

# **Chelsea Tee Time System and Requests**

Submitted by the Golf Committee

"Chelsea" is the online system in Sun City Texas for requesting and processing tee times for our three golf courses. Occasionally, questions arise about how this system actually processes our requests and determines the tee times for each day's play. Below is a description of how Chelsea determines tee time requests with appropriate priorities.

### **HOW CHELSEA WORKS**

The Chelsea Tee Time system is designed to provide an equitable distribution for all tee time requests. There are a few steps taken to ensure that equitable distribution is taking place.

- Step 1: All requests are randomly assigned a number between 0 and 66,000
- Step 2: All requests are separated into two categories:
  - 1. "Request Category 1" is comprised of residents without guests
  - "Request Category 2" is comprised of residents with guests

Each Request in Category 1 is given a tee time before the placement of Category 2 begins. If there is a request with three linked groups and one of those groups has a guest, all three groups are placed in Request Category 2.

- Step 3: "Request Category 1" is placed according to the randomly assigned number given in Step 1. The program begins with the lowest number first and proceeds in that fashion, low to high, until all requests in Category 1 are placed.
- **Step 4:** "Request Category 2" is placed in the same fashion as Category 1.

# **BENEFITS**

One of the uniquely beneficial aspects of the Chelsea Tee Time system is that it never turns away a request. If a resident creates a request, they will receive a tee time at one of the three courses. If you are a resident who plays golf and you are not in the Chelsea Tee Time system, please feel free to visit one of the Golf Shops to receive access and begin utilizing this effective software. **Note:** The new Sun City Texas website, coming later this year, will not have any effect on the current Chelsea tee time assignment procedure.



# Warm Weather Safety Tips

- Apply sunscreen liberally and often—skin can take up to 30 minutes to absorb sunscreen, so be sure to apply it about 30 minutes before going outside. Once you're outdoors, reapply sunscreen every two hours.
- Wear sun-protective clothing: Sunglasses with UV protection, wide-brim hats, UPF clothing, or tightly woven, dark-colored fabrics that cover your skin.
- Make a travel-size sunsafety kit. Create a kit that can hold sunscreen, lip balm, sunglasses, a hat, and a long-sleeved, light-weight shirt—keep your kit in your car and on your golf cart.
- Stay hydrated! Keep water with you at all times, especially when you're out for long periods in the sun.

ormed in 1997, the Nature Club of Sun City Texas continues to be a monument of conservation, education and enjoyment of nature—here at home in Sun City and abroad. Members gather to observe, learn and discuss the many aspects of nature, from the grandeur of astronomy to the small grace of native butterflies.

The club is comprised of six Special Interest Groups (SIGs), which are available to all members:

- Amphibians & Reptiles: This group studies indigenous herptiles, and several members also provide reptile and snake removal services.
- Astronomy: This group studies aspects of our universe, from our solar system to deep space.
- Birding: Through bi-monthly Bird Walks and field trips, this group enjoys observing feathered friends in their natural habitat.

• Butterfly: The Butterfly SIG promotes the preservation and study of native butterflies and moths in their natural habitat.

- Native Plants: This group encourages education on the topics of native plants and utilizing native plants in landscaping. Members often participate in Native Plant Walks and field trips.
- Rockhounds: The Rockhounds SIG studies rocks, minerals and natural geological formations locally and statewide.

These groups host many on-site activities, such as bird watching on Sun City trails, and excursions far and wide, including recent trips to Bamberger Ranch and Canyon Gorge. Despite the many different interests, club members also gather each month for an informative meeting with various topics, including recent presentations on water conservation and native bees.

Membership for 2014 is approaching 300 members and will continue to grow throughout the year, according to President Joe Bennett. Dues are \$12 annually, and membership includes access to meetings, informational resources, ability to participate in the SIGs, and club events like their Spring Fling Social and the year-end holiday party.

Mike and Kathy Van Fleet prove that you can have both a property that tantalizes the eye and a water bill that hovers at just below miserly. This is their second Sun City home, and this time they enlisted the services of an Austin-based professional designer who mapped multiple raised beds and included pathways to adequately channel the Texas-sized rainfalls that occur in this area. In addition, they took the water wise steps of incorporating drip irrigation throughout the entire yard, selecting only plants with low water requirements and using ground pecan shells as mulch. As you enter the back yard, a bronze Greater Roadrunner stands jauntily atop a rock outcropping inviting you to take in the garden's delights. Everywhere you look there is something to delight the eye such as live oaks, a fig tree, yuccas, cactus, rock outcroppings and a water feature. Sweat equity is not a term to be taken lightly in the hot central Texas sun. However, with the design in hand, the Van Fleets truly "made it happen" by putting in place themselves each rock, paver, plant and cubic yard of soil mix. And the results (and their water bills) are downright amazing.
